#### **Current SJS Expense Management Initiatives:**

- Monitoring and Control of Operational Costs while achieving various Physical Plant updates such as installation of energy efficient lighting, updates to school Wi-Fi access, and installation of new classroom flooring begun in the Summer of 2016.
- Maintain adequate credentialed staffing to insure quality education with the goal to maximize the use of the strengths of faculty (Spanish K-8, computer literacy)
- Utilize online text materials as opposed to purchasing hardcopies of updated textbook series

# **Bristol Catholic Elementary School Board Finance Committee** focus for 2016/2017 is:


- Cost savings / resource sharing in target areas such as webmaster/technology lead, language arts (Spanish) and offering of advanced placement options such as Honors Math.
- o Plan for Year 3 when subsidy for SAS students disappears (example: increased tuition assistance, grants)
- o Confirm faculty and staff compensation conforms to the Archdiocesan salary scale recommendations.
- o Provide funding for special programs / joint efforts shared teachers, new initiatives, fund for marketing costs
- Suggest ways both schools can reduce fundraising pressure on parents and parish subsidy can be eliminated
- Tuition consistency -Assess tuition threshold and provide support for tuition increases to reduce fundraising
